I. Call to Order

The Tulsa County Criminal Justice Authority (TCCJA) met at the hour of 8:30 AM. Stan Sallee, Chairman, called the meeting to order at 8:30 AM, and the following business was transacted:

II. Roll Call

III. Consider and Vote on Minutes

A. Minutes of meeting - March 25, 2026

IV. Reports, Recommendations and Possible Action

A. Budget Office Report - Aaron Wiedman, Senior Budget Analyst

The Tulsa County Clerk's Budget Office submitted written reports which were reviewed by Aaron Wiedman.

1. Claims (Purchase Orders / Payroll) April & May

The Budget Office requested approval for Claims (Purchase Orders/Payroll) in the amount of 3,465,280.24.

2. Appropriations

The Budget Office requested approval for Appropriations in the amount of \$2,874,908.25.

Motion made by Stan Sallee, seconded by Lonnie Sims, to approve. Upon roll call, Yes - Stan Sallee, Lonnie Sims, Larry Shafer, Debra Wimpee, Kelly Dunkerley. No - None. Abstain - None. Motion carried.

3. Report on Budgets, Revenues and Expenditures

Wiedman provided an overview of the budget, explaining that support personnel expenditures are currently ahead of expectations, while three programs overall remain under budget. Monthly overtime saw a significant drop in April, which is a positive indicator as the fiscal year comes to a close. However, the County contributions fund 365 reflects inflated revenue due to back billing, and US Marshals housing is currently at 63%, which raises concerns for the end of fiscal year 26 and the start of fiscal year 27. Specific tax collections, including use tax and sales tax, are performing well, and commissary funds have shown a significant turnaround compared to the previous fiscal year.

B. Sheriff's Report – Sheriff Regalado / Stacie Holloway, Jail Administrator

Major Berry presented the Sheriff's report for April, providing details on the inmate count 1460. Including 212 Muskogee Creek Nation 65 Cherokee Nation Detainees and 133 U.S. Marshall Detainees. The report also noted upcoming program updates, including the expansion of the GED program in June and the start of a food vendor benchmark on July 1. Sheriff Regalado addressed the impact of the US Marshals' per diem rate adjustment on housing numbers, explaining that the rate was set by the US Marshals and may require a firm stance moving

forward. Additionally, Commissioner Dunkerley asked about per diem rates for tribal nations, and Sheriff Regalado responded by outlining the current contract terms and the possibility of future adjustments.

C. Court Services/Tulsa County Criminal Justice Planning and Policy Council - Mary McDonald, Chief Court Services Officer

Mary McDonald provided an update on court services and community programs, noting that pre-trial release numbers have seen a slight decline, though efforts are ongoing to improve review processes. Community service participation has also decreased; however, participants have continued to provide meaningful service to Tulsa County. The Women in Recovery program has maintained steady participation levels. Additionally, the Planning and Policy Committee discussed an increase in community sentencing pleas, and the Stepping Up Committee will be focusing its efforts on addressing frequent users of the jail system.

D. Sales Tax Overview Committee –Dr. Donald Tyler

Dr. Donald Tyler reported that the Sales Tax Overview Committee met April 27, 2026. He also gave his condolences and informed the board of the passing of Wilbert Collins.

E. Consider and Approve Audit Engagement Letter with Hinkle and Company for the Year Ending June 2026; Authorize Chairman to Execute and Deliver Response Upon Approval of Staff – Jennifer Wynn

Jennifer Wynn requested the board approve the Audit that was provided from Hinkle and Company. Motion made by Stan Sallee, seconded by Lonnie Sims, to approve. Upon roll call, Yes - Stan Sallee, Lonnie Sims, Larry Shafer, Debra Wimpee, Kelly Dunkerley. No - None. Abstain - None. Motion carried.
